- 1. What variety of cultures are represented in your neighborhood or in your classroom?
- 2. What is your favorite food? What culture might this have originated from?
- 3. What traditions does your family have? How might these traditions have developed?
- 4. How do the things that others do and say impact your behavior and viewpoints?
- 5. How do the things that you do and say impact others' behavior and viewpoints?
- 6. What are some things that we can learn from talking and listening to others with different backgrounds?
- 7. Besides food and music, what other aspects may vary from culture to culture?
